Qualifications: Must be a member of the Class of 2020. All students who try-out may not be getting an "F" in any class, or, a "D" in any class needed to graduate. The grades that will be used to make this determination will be the end of the 3rd quarter grades.

### **Time for speech: 1-2 minutes total**

Theme: "We Did It All"

Evaluation criteria: articulation, projection, eye contact, expressive voice, posture, content of the speech and relevance to the theme

Come to the audition prepared with 6 copies of a typed speech. (or turn one in the day before and we will make the copies)

\*\*\* If selected speaker(s) must commit to working with \_\_\_\_\_\_ to improve your speech and the performance of that speech.

#### **Speech Directions:**

- A graduation speech is a formal address made at a commencement ceremony in honor of the occasion. The ceremony will include several other presentations.
- Content and tone of the speech should be mostly serious, although touches of humor are appropriate.
- Include quotations from famous speakers.
- Tell brief anecdotes, but not long stories.
- Include some humor, but avoid silliness and disrespect
- Evaluate the school experience without slapstick or anger
- · Include the expected topics: congratulating fellow graduates, acknowledging teachers and administrators as well as parents
- Offer inspirational and optimistic advice
- Use formal and dignified language
- Rehearsals TBA. There may be additional rehearsals as needed. The valedictorian will also follow the same guidelines as above.
